Some of the issues our Supervisor, Judy Pflueger and the BOS are working on now are budget crunches, medical marijuana, and the effect of the ending of the Forest Reserve will have on our schools.

The BOS have been restructuring to improve efficiency, and imposing a soft hiring freeze as they work with the ever tightening budget constraints. A soft hiring freeze means any job request must be approved by the BOS. Supervisor Pflueger said they were all looking forward to next year with the hope the budget will not be so tight.

Supervisor Pflueger said our schools are facing the possibility that the Forrest Reserve will not be extended one more year. When the Forrest Reserve ends, some of the schools will be in a very bad position. Some schools were able to keep some of that money from previous years in reserve, prolonging tough cut decisions.

TC/CC Fire Chief, Roger Chatterton reports winter is the slowest time of the year for CCVFD - TCVFD. He said, "For Jan/Feb your volunteer fire departments handled 7 medicals and 2 traffic collisions (one of which was a DUI) and held 4 trainings. For the same period in 2007 the departments handled 6 medicals, 3 traffic collisions and held 5 trainings, so the pace is roughly the same. As soon as the weather clears enough to allow access to the needed sites, both departments will be doing rappelling training. For some this will be a refresher for what they have already done, and for others it will be their initial training in cliff rescue operations.

The Trinity Center/Coffee Creek Red Cross Disaster Action Team will meet Thursday, March 6 at 6:00 pm for a pot luck/training meeting at the Eyman Home. We have several new members that we will be introducing to the Disaster Services by viewing a CD and
